Welcome new fifth graders! In order to prepare for next year, you will have a Summer Reading assignment to be completed and turned in on the first day of school.

You will read the Newbery Award winning *Number the Stars* by Lois Lowry. A copy of this book is available from Mrs. Wilson. **Please do not lose your book!** These books, along with the assignment, must be turned in to me on the first day of school, and it will count against the overall assignment grade if your copy is missing. If you want to buy your own copy instead of borrowing mine, *Number the Stars* is available in the children's section of most bookstores and libraries.

The Assignment: *five paragraph essay*. After reading the novel completely, you will need to write an essay answering the following question: *Through her experiences what did Annemarie discover about courage, pride and friendship?*

This should be answered in the five paragraph essay format (introduction, 3 body paragraphs, conclusion). Each body paragraph must give a *different*, specific detail about Annemarie's experiences, explaining and giving examples of what she has learned.

Because *Number the Stars* deals with World War II and the Holocaust (two subjects you may not know very much about), I am including a **brief encyclopedia article** with the book. Please read it before starting the novel, it will aid your understanding of the events in the book.

A Brief History Lesson on World War II

World War II (abbreviated **WWII**), or the **Second World War**, was a worldwide conflict which lasted from 1939 to 1945.

In the six years preceding World War II, Adolf Hitler, leading the Nazi Party, took power in Germany and got rid of its democratic (free) government.

The immediate causes of World War II are generally held to be the German invasion of Poland, as well as the Japanese attacks on China, the United States, and the British and Dutch colonies. All of the attacks resulted from the dictatorships in Germany and Japan. World War II began after these acts of hostility were met with an official declaration of war.

This global conflict split the majority of the world's nations into two opposing sides: the Allies (mainly U.S., Canada, Britain, and Russia) and the Axis (mainly Germany, Japan, and Italy). Spanning much of the globe, World War II resulted in the deaths of over 60 million people, making it the deadliest conflict in human history.

World War II was the most widespread war humanity has ever experienced, involving over 100 million soldiers from 61 nations, with fighting covering over 20 million km.

The Holocaust is the term used to describe the systematic killing of approximately six million European Jews during World War II, as part of a program by the Nazi government in Germany led by Adolf Hitler.
